


Escape for a short break to the historic city of Canterbury



Mining Museum aims to share and celebrate the story of energy in the county – from coal mining through to sustainable energy. Opening within the new state-of-the-art Visitor Centre in 2018, the museum will include exciting, interactive displays telling visitors how coal was discovered, how it was mined and about the day-today lives of the miners who worked at the collieries and insights into the communities that surrounded them. The unique collection includes photographic records, personal stories and memories, formal records and documents plus remarkable artefacts. The museum will provide a focus for the four Kent collieries of Betteshanger, Snowdown, Tilmanstone and Chislet and their nearby communities of Aylesham, Elvington and Hersden. Providing opportunities for formal and informal learning, the museum will enable a wide range of people to participate in, and learn about, the largely untold story of Kent's rich mining heritage.

WHAT'S NEW?



EASTGATE HOUSE REFURBISHED

In Rochester, the Grade I listed 16th and 17th century **Eastgate House** has reopened following a major restoration. Once the family home of Sir Peter Buck, a senior officer at the Royal Tudor Dockyard, the house has also been a Victorian boarding school, a hostel, a museum and an inspiration to the author Charles Dickens. During the works, original features and decorative schemes have been restored, new heating and lighting has been installed and access upgraded with a lift at the back of the building. The second floor of the house is open to visitors for the first time in 40 years. Groups can combine a visit to Eastgate House with a trip to **Rochester Cathedra**l.



The first Royal Harbour Festival will take place in Ramsgate, Britain's only Royal Harbour, from 15th to 17th June 2018. Taking place in the harbour and at other nearby sites in the town, the event will showcase the town's extraordinary coastal and maritime history and will raise money for local charities supporting both education and heritage regeneration projects.



COACH FRIENDLY DOCKYARD

The Historic Dockyard, Chatham

is the first Kent attraction to be awarded Coach Friendly Status by the Confederation of Passenger Transport UK. The award recognises that the attraction understands the needs of coach passengers and drivers offering facilities such as dedicated drop-off and collection points, great access and information. A dedicated groups team is on hand to help GTOs plan their day around the Dockyard's historic maritime buildings, ships and interactive galleries as well as booking tours taking in the site's story as a location in films such as Les Miserables and TV series including Call the Midwife.




HIDDEN HEVER CASTLE

Hever Castle near Edenbridge is to offer a new tour in 2018 for groups. Hidden Hever will provide access to Hever Castle's rooms that are not open to the general public. Discounts are available for groups of over 15 people and there is free coach parking.

WINE SANCTUARY OPENS A new state-of-the-art tasting room has


A new state-of-the-art tasting room has opened at the **Chapel Down winery** in Tenterden. This custom-built tasting room with a bespoke wine bar enables Chapel Down to meet the growing demand for knowledge of high quality wines and it can welcome up to 60 guests at a time. In-depth tastings of the range are carried out with one of the Wine & Spirit Education Trust trained tour guides and, on occasion, with Head Winemaker Josh Donaghay-Spire, Tours of the winery and vineyards are also available and The Swan Wine Kitchen serves lunches and dinner. Joint group itineraries are available with local attractions including the **Old Dairy Brewery** and the National Trust property, **Smallhythe Place**. Minimum group size is 15 people.






CATHEDRAL GARDEN TRAIL

Since medieval times, **Canterbury Cathedral** has welcomed visitors and the building together with **St Augustine's Abbey** and **St Martin's Church** make up **Canterbury's World Heritage Site**. The Cathedral's Christian heritage, architecture, stained glass and other artefacts can be explored as part of a pre-booked themed guided tour or through a self-guided audio visual tour. New is a garden trail taking in the beautiful and tranquil areas around the historic building. The **Memorial Garden** pays tribute to those who lost their lives during the Great War, and other peaceful spaces include the **Friends' Garden**, **Herb Garden** and the **Water Tower Garden**. Ruins from the old monastery can also be seen in places and private garden tours can be booked. Events run in the Cathedra throughout the year and include choral concerts while choirs have the chance to sing informal midday recitals. Groups can also book accommodation in the **Cathedral Lodge** - next to the Cathedral.







IGHTHAM MOTE'S SINGER EXHIBITION EXTENDED

Ightham Mote's special exhibition 'The Queen of Ightham, - An American Interlude: Queen Palmer, John Singer Sargent and the Circle' will be continuing at the National



Trust property near
Maidstone, until at least
June 2018. The exhibition
looks at the period in the
late 1880s when lghtham
Mote was a hub for the
Aesthetic Movement.
It's hoped that Singer
Sergeant's painting 'A
Game of Bowls', originally
painted on lghtham
Mote's north lawn, will be
included, and that monies
can be raised to purchase it
for the collection forever.

Knole in Sevenoaks will be offering an exclusive joint package to groups to enable them to visit two of Kent's finest heritage attractions in one day. Visitors will start at Chiddingstone Castle with a guided tour of the house with its Tudor origins and the newly-opened Victorian rooms, where they will see Japanese, Ancient Egyptian and Buddhist artefacts and uncover a story of unrequited love and attempted murder. After enjoying a ploughman's lunch at the Castle, travel to Knole (National Trust and 20-minutes away) to discover 600 years of history at the vast property, which is more like a town than a house! Its world-class furniture and art includes the newly acquired portrait of the Chevalier de Champcenetz by Gainsborough. Following restoration, the Ballroom, Reynolds Room, Cartoon Gallery, King's Closet and King's Room have re-opened, with other state rooms now being refurbished to open in spring 2019. Groups are welcome on weekdays during school term time, and, as part of a visit, groups can get insights into how the conservation of precious treasures is being carried out.

MAIDSTONE'S TRIPLE LAUNCH


Three new attractions will open in Maidstone in 2018. The town's Mote Park will introduce an adventure zone, while Maidstone Museum & Art Gallery will reveal a fresh look to the Ancient Civilisations Wing. This includes a facial reconstruction of the famous mummy Ta-Kush created following its scan in a MRI scanner, and the resulting model can be touched by partially and non-sighted visitors. Nearby, at Tonbridge's Headcorn Aerodrome, the Lashenden Air Warfare Museum will be redeveloped and a new wing is planned to open at the end of June.





VR EXPLORES MEDIEVAL ABBEY

Cathedral in stature and influence, and it now offers visitors the chance to experience many of its key features through a virtual reality experience. Introduced in summer 2017, visitors can sit inside a high-tech 'pod' and use VR headsets to experience a medieval virtual reality which 'rebuilds' significant parts of the abbey and allows them to view the ornate buildings as they would have looked in the early 16th century. A joint ticket is available with the nearby **The Canterbury Tales** visitor attraction.



ANIMAL ADVENTURES

From big cats to cute Guinea pigs, Kent's wildlife parks are home to creatures great and small. Each offers a fantastic day out for your group.



For encounters with exotic animals, head to **Howletts Wild Animal Park** near Canterbury and **Port Lympne Reserve** in Hythe. At Howletts, walk alongside freeroaming lemurs, spot the UK's largest elephant herd, and
prowl the open top monkey enclosure. At Port Lympne
stroll the primate trail, hop on a safari vehicle to watch
giraffe, rhino and wildebeest, before entering carnivore
territory to discover lions, tigers, cheetah and more.
You'll encounter hordes of British wildlife, past and
present, at Herne Bay at **Wildwood Trust**, where more
than 200 native animals live in a 40-acre forest. Stand-by
to meet wolves and owls, as well as beavers, badgers,
histor and boar

At Wingham Wildlife Park close to Canterbury, the animals range from ants to wallabys, with countless creatures in between. This reserve specialises in exotic birds and small animals - sign up for an Experience Day and do everything from Meet the Tiger, to Shadow a Reptile Keeper. For a more gentle adventure, experience life on the farm at the Rare Breeds Centre, at Woodchurch, near Ashford, with a stroll around some of its 100 unspoilt acres revealing rare breed pigs, chickens, lambs, horses and ducks and more.

AT FULL STEAM!




A nostalgic trip taking in one or more of Kent's heritage railways captures the imagination - there's a lot of history to discover alongside amazing views.

With quintessentially English stations and lovingly restored steam and diesel engines, Kent's heritage railways offer a range of experiences. Five railways run through the county, each distinctly different and offering a combination of fabulous views, fantastic destinations and fascinating history. Ride the small steam trains on the Romney, Hythe and Dymchurch Railway from Hythe to Dungeness, or journey on the 13-mile Kent & East Sussex Railway between Tenterden and Bodiam. Groups can also steam through the beautiful countryside, enjoying a destination at every station with the Spa Valley Railway, which runs for five miles from Eridge to Tunbridge Wells West via Groombridge and High Rocks. Elsewhere, uncover the industrial pasts of the East Kent Railway running between Shepherdswell and Eythorne, and the Sittingbourne & Kemsley Railways running from Sittingbourne to Kemsley Down. Meet the friendly volunteers, enjoy charming afternoon teas, and enjoy a great day out with your group.

During this special event at Hever Castle, Edenbridge, groups can enjoy free garden tours and talks with master grower, Johnny Walker of Walkers Bulbs.



SUMMER COLOUR

GET CLOSE TO NATURE AT THE NATIONAL TRUST

National Trust properties to explore in Autumn include Sevenoaks' Emmetts Garden's exotic tree collection in fiery reds as well as golds and the 100-year-old purple cut-leaved Japanese Maples below the Bastion at Scotney Castle, Tunbridge Wells. While the parkland at Knole and Ightham Mote (both Sevenoaks) is beautiful as the leaves fall to the ground mingling with fungi and chestnuts.





Vineyard tours and wine tasting experiences are available at many of Kent's grape-growing specialists. Amongst those welcoming groups are several in the Ashford and Tenterden area including Chapel Down Winery, Biddenden Vineyards and Gusbourne, **Squerryes in Westerham and Hush Heath Estate in Staplehurst. At Hush** Heath, the winery's experts offer pre-booked guided vineyard tours of the estate (minimum six people) where visitors can learn all aspects of grape-growing before discovering the state-of-the-art winery where the process of still and sparkling winemaking is explained before a tutored tasting of six Hush Heath Estate wines and ciders.



FOOD & DRINK

No visit to Kent is complete without sampling some of its exceptional food and drink, all produced in the county. You will be spoilt for choice!

EXCELLENT CIDER AND ALE

Tiddly Pomme, at Brogdale Farm, the home of the National Fruit Collections, specialises in local ciders hand-pressed using fruit from the orchards - which groups can tour from April to October. Shepherd Neame Brewery (pictured), Britain's oldest brewer, is in the centre of Faversham. Here, special tours introduce groups to the art of brewing from start to finish with chances to taste mineral water from the on-site well and to smell locally grown hops. Learn about the past in the Old Brewery Store with its historic delivery vehicles, bygone pub signs and end a tour with a tutored tasting of fine Kentish ales and speciality lagers. A new state of the art brewery is set to open in Ashford, run by Chapel Down, it will be called the Curious Brewery.





HAND CRAFTED SPIRITS

Copper Rivet Distillery at Chatham Dockyard offers tours and tastings to allow groups to see how gin, vodka and whisky are hand crafted from raw ingredients to the finest finished product. The tour includes learning the secrets of distilling and botanicals plus seeing the traditional stills created from copper by Chatham craftsmen. Tours take around an hour and end with a tasting in the visitor centre or on the Distillers Lawn overlooking the river on sunny days.

HIMALAYAN AFTERNOON TEA

Afternoon teas with homemade cakes and biscuits are a popular part of a day out, and an unusual place amidst gorgeous surroundings to indulge in this luxury is at Riverhill Himalayan Gardens close to Sevenoaks. Teas can be booked as part of a visit to the gardens or independently.

FAVERSHAM'S TASTY FOOD

Faversham market takes place three times a week with an array of seasonal fruits and vegetables many grown by local producers - as well as meat, artisan bakers, and makers of fine cakes. Open every day is the south east's leading food hall. Macknade Fine Foods (pictured). The independent retailer is offering bespoke group packages in 2018. There's something for everyone, with produce ranging from exotic fruit to craft beers, fresh bread to Italian truffles. The delicatessen has one of the largest ranges of cheese and charcuterie in the UK, with 150 cheeses alone, and the adjacent café makes exceptional dishes using ingredients found in-store. Private tasting sessions are available to book directly and include samples from the delicatessen counter and a brief history of the family owned company, which has just celebrated its 170 year anniversary. Packages can include lunch, afternoon tea or drinks alone and there is ample parking for coaches.





PRODUCED IN KENT

Throughout the county there are specialities and protected food names to look out for and, more importantly sample! Alongside Kentish Ales and Romney Marsh Lamb, groups can tuck into Whitstable Oysters in the town of the same name – or even try Dover Sole flavoured with Whitstable Sea Salt. SQUERRYES EXPERIENCES


Squerryes is a new winery in Westerham. Finest vintages and other Kentish drinks can be enjoyed alongside locally sourced charcuterie and cheese, while visitors are welcome to wander in the vineyard amongst the

experiences in the **Tasting Room** and for the tours
of the vineyard. There's
also an option to visit **Squerryes Court**, home to
Henry and Claire Warde,
owners of the estate and
the eighth generation
of Wardes to live in the
house, which is furnished
with fine art and furniture.

CULINARY CANTERBURY

Visitors to Canterbury can sample local ales at many hostelries including the Foundry Brew Pub, a craft brewery in White Horse Lane. Step back in time in the old Buttermarket which was once linked to the Cathedral by a series of tunnels and where there has been a pub for 500 years. Try its cask ales and British food or head to the Goods Shed (pictured) for a farmers market, food hall and restaurant stocking and serving locally sourced products.











TRAVEL TO KENT

Rail travel to and around Kent is operated by Southeastern. London Bridge, Charing Cross, London Waterloo East, Victoria and St Pancras International stations all connect to Kent destinations, with St Pancras International operating the High Speed service, taking less than 40 minutes from London. Eurostar services from Europe also stop at Ashford and Ebbsfleet international stations.

If travelling by **coach** and it's the group's first trip to Kent, the best way to get into the county from the UK is to head to London and the M25. Once on the M25, there are 2 directions into Kent; picking up either the M20 or M2 motorways which run through the centre of the county.

Kent is all accessible by **sea** and groups can find their sea legs with P&O Ferries and DFDS Seaways who both operate 90 minute services from Calais to the Port of Dover. DFDS operates an additional 2-hour crossing to Dunkerque. Coaches can also drive straight onto the Eurotunnel le Shuttle at Calais, for a 35-minute journey to Kent.

If arriving by air, London Gatwick and Heathrow offer worldwide connections into the south-east, and both airports are within easy reach of Kent, with both road and rail connections to each airport

BATTLE OF BRITAIN LIBRARY OPENS

In 2018, while commemorating important anniversaries such as the centenary of the forming of the RAF, the Battle of Britain Memorial Trust continues to look to the future. The Trust will celebrate the 25th anniversary of the unveiling of the National Memorial to the Few at Capel-le-Ferne on its cliff top site between Dover and Folkestone, and a new library and resource centre dedicated to the Battle of Britain, and those who fought it, will open there. Attractions such as the **Christopher Foxley-Norris Memorial Wall** and a replica Spitfire and Hurricane have year-round appeal, but the highlight of the Trust's year is Memorial Day, which, in 2018, falls on Sunday 1st July.



ON THE FRONTLINE

For centuries, Kent's position as the 'Front Line' of Britain's defences has been vital. Research continually sheds light on the county's role and opens up ways to connect with the past.

NEW EXHIBITION AT DEAL CASTLE

Deal Castle, with its cannons, turrets, moat and maze of passageways, is one of the earliest and most elaborate of Tudor artillery castles. It was built rapidly and 'without sparing any cost' between 1539 and 1542 by order of King Henry VIII. A new permanent exhibition at this English Heritage attraction with displays, audio and activities, supported by contemporary artefacts, reveals how Henry VIII's fear of invasion shaped the country's defences and his own married life. Never-before-seen objects, including the breech chamber from a late 16th century gun and a copper powder flask lid with intricate horse decoration dating from the 17th century, highlight the castle's purpose as an artillery fort with an active garrison. The stories of the people who lived and worked there for over 400 years are explained and in the newlyopened Captain's apartments, the story of General Sir John French, 1st Earl of Ypres, who commanded the British Expeditionary Force in 1914-15 and established a chapel in the castle is told.



DEFENSIVE GEMS

Kent's many other attractions tell the story of how the county protected the realm. In Folkestone the **Kent Battle of Britain Museum** holds the country's largest collection of artefacts connected to the battle; the **Royal Military Canal**



in Hythe dates from Napoleonic times and its 28 miles provide cycling and walking routes – or you can hire a boat for a cruise; at **Upnor Castle** (pictured), built by Queen Elizabeth I, learn about the disastrous Dutch raid in 1667 – groups can opt for a **Jetstream Tour** for a view from the River Medway. Elsewhere, **Tonbridge Castle** is one of England's finest motte and bailey fortifications!

UNDERGROUND RAMSGATE


As World War II approached, Ramsgate Borough Council embarked on ambitious plans to construct over two miles of bombproof deep shelter tunnels to protect the civilian population of the town. These tunnels became the most extensive public underground system in the country and a 'town within a town' where, on 24th August 1940, around 300 families took to living in the tunnels on a permanent basis when 500 German bombs were dropped on Ramsgate in just five minutes. Tours of the tunnels are now available and using recordings from those who took refuge there, they give insights into life underground and a unique glimpse of Ramsgate's heritage.



400 YEARS OF MARITIME EXCELLENCE

The Historic Dockyard Chatham is the only place in the world where a complete dockyard from the age of sail and beyond can be explored and in 2018 it celebrates 400 years of history. The Dockyard had a unique role in the country's maritime past and has made an unmatched contribution to the Royal Navy's shipbuilding excellence that led to worldwide command of the oceans. Chatham offers unrivalled access to ships that shaped the world, from a Victorian anti-slavery sailing ship and a Second World War Destroyer to a Cold War submarine, as well as telling the stories of the people who made them. From historic buildings such as the Commissioner's House and officers' quarters, and the remarkable Victorian ropery (where the rigging for HMS Victory was made) to its collection of maritime archaeology, the Dockyard forms an indispensable part of Britain's naval heritage.

Activities, exhibitions and celebrations to captivate all ages are planned for 2018. In March, the exhibition 'Time, Tide and Power' - featuring objects from national institutions such as Tate Britain - will open and, in the summer, a major temporary exhibition, 'Brick History!' will see famous scenes from history recreated in Lego® including the death of Nelson on board HMS Victory.

OCEAN WATCH

Amongst the 17 listed churches cared for by the **Churches Conservation Trust (CCT)** in Kent is **St Peter's** in the Cinque Port of Sandwich. (The CCT is the national charity with the remit of saving historic churches at risk.) St Peter's has 800 years of history and a curfew bell is still rung each day at 8.00pm. Visitors journey through the ages as they climb to the top of the newly re-opened medieval tower – where there's a bird's eye view over England's most complete medieval town! Hand-held guides help locate landmarks and on a clear day it's possible to catch a glimpse of France. There's discounted entry for groups of more than eight people.




